Your child **must** read for a **minimum** of 20 minutes **every day**. Your child will be given a reading record which must be regularly filled in. Children will also need to work on their individual maths target and spellings. Additional homework will start to go out, in due course.

Subject	Details	How you can help
English	For writing, children will be looking at texts which link to our Creative topic 'Crime and Punishment'. They will be inspired to write narratives based on a range of popular horror stories as well as creating non-chronological reports. For reading, children will be looking at a range of texts and building on their skills of inference and recall. They will also further develop their vocabulary and predictive skills.	Read regularly with your child and discuss their books. Please help them complete their reading record card Encourage children to revise their grammar and use this at home.
Maths	We will be looking at measurement, including area and perimeter, and converting between units of measurement. Children will also continue to solve problems, which will involve multiplying, dividing, subtracting and adding. The children are expected to work very hard on achieving their maths passport before Christmas.	Learn passport facts by heart Work through real life problems, including money and time.
Science	<u>Space</u> Children will be learning about the mysteries of the galaxy. They will look at the various planets, their relationship with the sun and the movement of the moon. In addition, children will be going to the IMAX to watch a 3D movie entitled 'Hubble' to further increase their understanding and knowledge.	Ask your child to describe the differences between the planets and their relationship to the sun and moon.
ICT	Scratch- Children will be continuing to use and develop their understanding of coding through the use of the programme Scratch.	Ensure that e-safety guidance is followed at home and children do not use computers or mobile devices unsupervised.
P.E	During Year 5, children will take part in weekly swimming sessions at Bingley Pool, working towards National Curriculum standard. Children will also be developing further on team work skills.	Encourage outdoor play.
R.E	We will be studying sacred places looking at religious buildings and their features	Discuss how many different religious buildings there are in Manningham
M.F.L	Revising days and times, while learning phrases about Christmas and people's hobbies.	Ask your child to recall French vocabulary.
