#### A reminder about uniform

If you are missing any of these items they are available from supermarkets and do not have to be purchased from specialist uniform shops. #### **PE Kits**

Your child should wear their PE kits to school on the days they have PE. PE kits include **black trainers**, plain black jogging bottoms, a plain white T-shirt and a plain black hoody or jumper.

It's a great idea to write your child's name onto the label of their uniform to help them find any items of clothing they may have lost or misplaced.

This is an easier way for you to report your child's absence from school.

A reminder that it is parents' responsibility to contact school by 9am if your child is going to be absent from school. This can be done via the Studybugs App or by phone and must be done for every day they are absent. If you do not contact school to report a child's absence this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence and may result in penalty notices being issued by Bradford Council Education, Attendance and Safeguarding Team.
